

■For the Sake of the Unsaved

(1 Peter 2:11-12) As Christians, we must constantly remind ourselves who we are; and Peter did this in 1 Peter 2:11. To begin with, we are Gods dearly beloved children. Eight times in his two epistles, Peter reminded his readers of God's love for them (1 Peter 2:11; 4:12; 2 Peter 1:7; 3:1,8,14-15,17). In ourselves, there is nothing that God can love; but He loves us because of Jesus Christ. This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased"(2 Peter 1:17). Because of our faith in Jesus Christ, we are accepted in the beloved" (Eph 1:6). Our love relationship" to Jesus Christ ought to be around us, we must live *honest* lives. This word implies much more than telling the truth and doing what is right. It carries with it the idea of beauty, comeliness, that which is admirable and honorable.
