The Biblical Pattern of Teaching

ver and over again in Paul's last words to Timothy and Titus he returned to the the church across the ages demanded transmission of Bible truths. Probably one of the most quoted verses from the Pastoral Epistles is 2 Tim 2:2: *And the things you have* heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable men who will also be qualified to teach others."

Much of our education in Sunday School as well as in special training and discipleship classes hopes to do just this: entrust the task of teaching so that truth may be passed on to the next generation.

But we are so confident we know what 'teaching" means that we may fail to ask what it meant to Paul when he wrote to Timothy and Titus. In our society teaching is imparting knowledge and processing information; learning is acquiring knowledge and using information. It's hard for us to realize that

teaching did not have the same meaning for Paul or Timothy or other early the readers of these letters. The Hebrew concept of education was not "to impart knowledge" or to "prepare oneself intellectually." It was to

produce holiness and to impart a distinctive lifestyle. When Paul wrote to Timothy and Titus about the importance of teaching in the church, his concept of education was Hebrew, not twenty-first century.

In each of his three last letters (1&2 Timothy & Titus) Paul seems to plunge immediately into statements about the goal of Christian teaching. In 1 Timothy he warned against false doctrine and urged commitment to the truth. Paul stated succinctly his goal in teaching the truth: that goal is "love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith" (1 Tim 1:5). In 2 Timothy, Paul brought up the same issue. "What you have heard from me, keep as the pattern of sound teaching, with faith and love in Christ Jesus" (2 Tim 1:13). And in the opening of Titus, Paul spoke immediately of "the knowledge of the truth that leads to godliness" (Titus 1:1). The goals that Paul had in mind for teaching in the church aren't limited to gaining intellectual knowledge. In fact, Bible knowledge is never an end in itself t is to produce loss forth and godliness itself. It is to produce love, faith, and godliness

in our lives. If we take our stance with the Apostle Paul, we realize that evidence of Christian learning is not found in what is known. It is instead found in the love, faith, and godliness that are to mark the believer's life. Paul urged Timothy and Titus to be engaged in the kind of teaching that links truth with life; the kind of teaching that has as its product Paul would say that character is a better indicator of a well-taught Christian than knowledge. To him, teaching's goal is knowledge expressed in love, faith, and godliness. Truth and life - the "academic" and the "practical" must be intimately linked.

* Paul said sinful acts are *contrary* to sound doctrine" and do not conform to the *glorious* Gospel of the blessed God" (1 Tim 1:9-11).

* Paul expressed concern about how people ought to conduct themselves in God's household, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and foundation of the truth'(3:15).

* Paul's goal was knowledge of the truth that leads to godli-ness'(Titus 1:1). The Hebrew concept of education was not "to impart knowledge" or to "prepare one self intellectually." It was to produce holiness and to impart a distinctive lifestyle.

endurance, and reverence are *ln ac-*cord with sound doctrine'(2:1-3). * Paul encouraged Titus to stress basic

doctrinal truths so that those who have trusted in God may be careful to devote themselves to doing what is good'(3:8).

With these statements, what do we discover? First, the teaching ministry is one of shaping lives, not simply one of passing on even true information.

Second, Christian teaching deals with every aspect of our lives. The tensions of daily life, relationships with others - all these are the concerns on which Christian teaching is focused.

Third, we would conclude that *leaching*' is a very broad term. It simply means bringing the insights of Scripture to bear on the daily lives of learners by modeling, instructing, encouraging, advising, urging, exhorting, guiding, exposing, and convicting. The kind of teaching that Paul urged links

truth and life and communicates both content and lifestyle. Ω
