AN APPEAL FOR EVERYONE TO BE PATIENT

¬ rom the rich, James turned to the restless. For these he again used the friendly address, "brothers." The tone turns from stark condemnation to sensitive consolation. James rebuked the oppressive rich but encouraged the receptive. He appealed to his brethren to be patient. He defined the essence of patience, gave some examples of patience, and indicated an evidence of patience. [James 5:7-12]

1. ESSENCE OF PATIENCE (5:7-9)

Be patient, then (lit., "therefore"), said James as a direct effect to the coming judgment on the wicked rich. "Be patient" (makrothymesate) comes from a compound of "long" (makros) and "temper" (thymos). The idea is to set the timer of one's temper for a long run. Think long. Focus on the final lap in the race of life. Have a long fuse. Look ahead to the Lord's coming. The essence of patience is furthermore seen in the farmer who waits patiently (makrothymon) for the needed rains and the ultimate valuable or precious crop. The application is clear. Just like the farmer, every believer should be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near.

The Lord's return should stimulate every believer to patience and persistence. James called for the believers to stop groaning lest they be judged, because Jesus the Judge is standing at the door! In view of the hope of Christ's soon return, believers should cease their petty conflicts. As children in a school classroom look out for their teacher's soon return, God's children should be on guard for Christ's return. In so doing, good behavior and mutual harmony are essential.

2. EXAMPLES OF PATIENCE (5:10-11)

James reminded his Jewish brothers of the prophets who endured much suffering with natience (makrothymia, lit., "longlit., temperedness") as they spoke out in the name of the Lord. As you know (lit., "behold"), we consider blessed (lit. "happy or fortunate"; ma*karizomen*) those who have persevered. James then presented another well-known and highly revered example of patience, Job. The Lord honored Job's perseverance with multiplied blessings (Job 42:12). Interestingly, James say that Job had "steadfastness, endurance, perseverance." Job endured and he was steadfast.

God wants him to say, sense what God wants him to sense, and share what God wants him to share. Spiritual maturity involves patience in every aspect of life. Ω

James summed it up: The Lord is full of

compassion and mercy. "Full of compassion" is

a compound adjective (polysplanchnos, from

polys, "much," and splanchna, "innermost parts" or "seat of affections"). And since we

are His disciples, we are to imitate Him and

Above all, my brothers, concluded James, do

not swear or take an empty oath. For those who

truly demonstrate the persistence and patience

prescribed for believers, there is no need to invoke an oath, whether by heaven or by earth,

that their word is certain. ("Swear" does not

refer to profanity but to taking an oath.) The testimony should be such that when one says

yes, it means yes, and when he says no, that is

just what he means (cf. Matt 5:37). The soon

return of the Lord, the Judge who stands at the

door (James 5:9), is motivation enough for this

kind of honesty and trustworthiness. Test one be

condemned (lit., "fall under judgment").

A fitting climax to James letter is his

emphasis on prayer. The greatest assistance any

believer can offer another is faithful prayer.

Prayer is clear evidence of patience and care.

Prayer is the "hotline" to the One who can

provide for any need no matter how complex or

impossible it may seem. To share in prayer,

a believer must have a patient sensitivity

to someone's needs, engage in diligent

supplication for those needs, and recognize

Perhaps the two greatest weaknesses in the

average congregation of believers today are the

areas of prayer and praise. The reason for these

weaknesses may be traced to insensitivity. There is much need for prayer and much cause

to praise. Suffering should elicit prayer. Sufficiency should elicit praise. James used

several questions to stress these points. "Is any

of you in trouble?"

trouble" (kakopathei, "suffering ill") relates to

suffering from any source. "Is anyone happy?

A believer should be what God wants him to

be, do what God wants him to do, say what

the significance of those needs.

Let him sing songs of praise.
