

CONFIDENCE IN JESUS, NOT IN FLESH

PHIL.3:1-6

INTRODUCTION:

In <u>2 Kings18:35</u>, with <u>full confidence</u> the Rabshekeh, spokesman of Sennacherib, king of Assyria, in Hebrew, bragged, "Who among all the gods of the lands have delivered their countries from my hand, that the Lord should deliver Jerusalem from my hand? In <u>2 Kings 19:35</u> the Angel of the Lord went out, and killed <u>185,000</u>, of the troops of Sennacherib!

BELIEVERS ARE TO HAVE NO CONFIDENCE IN THE FLESH

A. THE EXHORTATION INTRODUCED (Phil.3:1)

Apostle Paul called for a <u>spiritofrejoicing</u> before stressing the danger of confidence. The word "finally" is used to introduce a new subject as well as a clue that he had begun to conclude the letter. He used the same phrase again in Phil.4:8, so that some feel that chapter 3 is a digression from his main theme.

Paul called on the believers torejoicein the Lord. "Rejoice" appears 2x inPhil.1:18; 2x inPhil.2:17,18; 2x inPhil.3:1; and Phil.4:4. It seems that the Philippian Christians needed this word due to repeated emphasis.

Repetition is a vital part of learning orally or written. The apostle made no apology for repeating the instruction by writing the same things. It was not tiresome/tedious to him to review the necessities repeatedly because he felt constrained to do so for their benefit and to safeguard

B. THE EXAMPLES TO BE AVOIDED (Phil.3:2,3)

In Paul's time the Judaizers who were guilty of putting confidence in the flesh, so they plagued him and his converts persistently. Confused about the gospel, they added works of the law to faith in Christ on both salvation and for Christian living. Circumcision in the O.T. was of special concern to them, so they insisted that it was necessary for salvation. Paul called them "deceitful workers" in 2 Cor.11:13. for adding works of the flesh. In Phil.3:2, Paul called the Judaizers "dogs", men who do evil and mutilators of the flesh. He considered their works dangerous, ungodly, and the saints were not to follow them, but to watch out for them.

It was common for some Jews to refer gentiles as dogs, which were considered unclean animals. Paul used the term to describe those Jews who ruined the gospel by insisting on the need to mutilate the flesh to be rightly related to God. However, what they actually did was evil, even though they may have good intentions.

The O. T.rite of physical circumcision was not only a sign of covenant relationship, but was also related to spiritual circumcision of the heart (Deut.30:6). Paul's letter to the Gentiles made it clear that they were the true circumcision because, they worshipped by the Spirit of God but had no confidence in the flesh.

A child of God should glory (means "boast" or "exalt" (Phil.1:26; Phil.2:16; 2 Cor.10:17). in Christ alone, instead of boasting in worldly accomplishments as the Judaizers and the Jews did.

C. THE EXAMPLES TO BE FOLLOWED (Phil.3:4-6)

It can't be overly emphasized that Paul did not place any confidence in the flesh, because he gained victory over the temptation of the devil. His presentation in these verses was intended to review for the Philippians the things in which he could have placed confidence if he wanted to. In fact the list included things of great value and trust before he met Christ. He intends to show that in the flesh he could have boasted more, than any of the Judaizers.

The "anyone else" in Phil.3:4 referred to all those who place confidence in the flesh. Paul challenged the <u>Judaizers</u> to a showdown. His preliminary conclusion before he even got specific was that no matter what advantage was expressed by his opponents, his advantages exceeded theirs (Gal.1:14).

The advantages in Phil. 3:5,6 show what Paul have in the flesh but later counted them as loss for Christ.

1. Paul was Circumcisedon a specific time the eighth day - Lev.12:3 - he was a pure blooded Jew, not a proselyte or an Ishmaelite. Proselytes were circumcised later in life and Ishmaelites after age 13 (Gen.17:25,26)

2. Paul comes from the people of Israel. His parents were both true Jews, tamily lineage could be traced all the way back to Abraham (2)

Cor.11:22).
3. Paul was a Benjamite - the first king of Israel (1Sam.9:1,2) came from this tribe, which was highly honored and viewed with great esteem. The Benjamin tribe remained loyal to David's house, even after the kingdom was disrupted.
4. Paul's native tongue was Hebrew - He was well versed both in the language and customs of God's people. He was a Hebrew son of

Hebrew parents.

5. Paul was a Pharisee with regard to the Law- He was a member of the strictest sect among his people. Pharisees added their own

regulations to the Law of Moses, which means equal to the Law. 6.Paul was a Persecutor of the Church- He did this ceaselessly before his conversion to Christ (Acts 9:1,2). The Jewish religion with more zeal had boasted him for persecuting the church.

7. Paul excelled in "legalistic righteousness" in his own eyes he was faultless (amemptos), in Phil.2:15 decreed as "blameless"

CONCLUSION:

From the aforementioned passages, we learned that:

A. Believers are to have no confidence in the flesh as to exhortation introduced.

B. Believers are to have no confidence in the flesh as to the examples to be avoided.

C. Believers are to have no confidence in the flesh as to the examples to be followed. Amen?

Remember your Creator in the days of your youth, before the days of trouble come and the years approach when you will say, "I find no pleasure in them..." Ecclesiastes 12:1
